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### Ementa:

The rise of the digital-virtual world was already underway, but the covid-19 pandemic accelerated the transition to a new normality that quickly pushed us to learn how to interact through various video-mediated technologies, transcending boundaries from local to global. People began using video conferencing to talk with friends, collaborate at work, participate in meetings, consult healthcare professionals, attend international conferences, expand institutional activities, as well as enhance their leisure experiences through the virtual world.

Currently, there is a noticeable surge in studies within the fields of multimodal conversation analysis and interactional linguistics, aimed at documenting these novel sense-making practices from diverse perspectives. Considering the distinctive features of video-mediated interaction (VMI), including visually and auditorily fragmented environments, technological vulnerabilities, novel frameworks for participation, altered dynamics for eye contact and turn-taking coordination, integration of participants' visual representations, and the transition from a 3D to a 2D experience, this seminar will delve into the discourse of video-mediated interaction within this context.

Multilingual interaction, particularly communication in English as a lingua franca (ELF), is increasingly prevalent in the realm of VMI, as global networks continue to expand. We will explore how studies on multimodal interaction have thus far examined participants' strategies for constructing meaning these new environments across verbal, prosodic, and gestural dimensions, and how this new endeavor necessitates innovative transcription methodologies.

The seminar will be conducted in English and will feature contributions (through lectures and workshops) from collaborators at the Universities of JLU Gießen, the University of Potsdam, and the University of Duisburg-Essen.
